Each year, we survey Committee for Sydney members to understand what matters to leaders across our city, and how we can work together on the most important issues facing Sydney.


#### Sample

#### **Organisations representing**


- More than 404,802 jobs in Sydney (full-time, part-time and contract)

#### Who responded?




The survey responses represent senior leadership and management at the employers of 404,802 Sydneysiders.


### Turning to the national referendum on The Voice to Parliament:




Do you expect your organisation to support the referendum?

Will your organisation offer staff any educational information or briefings on the referendum?












## Which climate risks are you most concerned about?




## In your opinion, who is currently showing the most leadership in the transition to net zero?




## What is the biggest barrier to reaching net zero?




