






Demographic distribution 2024











How satisfied are you with your quality of life in Sydney?








How likely are Sydneysiders to move away from Sydney?
























Increased support for increased density in different parts of Sydney over the next 10 years






How important is it to you that you can live in a home with its own external back yard?




























How would you rate the flexibility of your workplace?






How satisfied are you with the flexibility your current job offers you?
















Question wording:

A reform being advocated by some is the idea of a road user levy on electric vehicles.

Currently funds from fuel tax go to the general federal budget. Because electric vehicles don't use petrol or diesel fuels, they don't contribute to road maintenance via fuel tax. Under the proposed changes, electric vehicles would pay the levy based on the distance they travel.

- Supporters of the road user levy on electric vehicles say that it will ensure electric vehicle owners pay their fair share.
- Opponents say that the levy will slow down the conversion to electric vehicles and cause more pollution.
























